









Q1:You told us previously that making the new leisure centre fun and family friendly was important to you. 




Qla: Would you bring your family to the new facility?

Headline Findings

- 1,085 people answered this question.
- 75% of respondents said yes, with
 9% saying no and 3% maybe.
- There was a substantial minority of 13% who did not answer the question or said that they did not have a family – these have been classed as N/A.








- Q3. We have also strengthened the connection between our new leisure facility and the historic buildings.






Q4a: Are there any other accessibility features that you would like to see?

Headline Findings

- 285 people answered this question.
- The most common response focused on comments pertaining to changing rooms and toilets, with (39) mentioning this aspect, followed by demand for a hydrotherapy pool (28)
- Dedicated disabled parking came up often (25).
- Also popular was provision of step in access to the pool (23), as well as facilities for those with learning difficulties (22).



Q5: We are conscious that the old Kingfisher was not sustainable and have put sustainability at the heart of our plans (through features like solar/PV panels, all-electric energy supply, rainwater harvesting, recycling existing materials where possible etc).






Q5a: If not, what more should we do to ensure the building is as sustainable as possible?

Headline Findings


- 274 people answered this question.
- As expected, the most common answer here was demand for refurbish over demolition (40).
- The facility being bike friendly was the second most popular theme (23)
- Calls for sustainable heat pumps, air source or ground (23) and for materials to be recycled (23) were the next most common answers.
- A green roof / walls (17) were also popular.



Q6: Do you have any other comments?

Headline Findings

- 658 people answered this question.
- A sense of urgency (99) was the most common theme, whilst the next most common was the cost (69).
- Many commented favourably on the strength of the design (49) and there were some who raised issues of accessibility (42).
- Others had comments relevant to sport provision (40).











Do you think a new modern centre will encourage more people to get active in Kingston?




Q3: The new leisure centre will have swimming pools, a gym, football pitches, squash and sports courts. Would this encourage you to play more sports?




Q4: Do you go to Kingston's Museum or Library?

- A total of 480 comments were received, with most comments stating that there was nothing missing or that they had no comments.
- Key themes that emerged were:
 - Affordability ensuring that local people and students were able to afford to visit the new centre
 - Requests for facilities already included in the plans such as badminton courts, a swimming pool, soft play for young
 children, basketball courts, studio space and sauna and steam facilities
 - Making the centre accessible to people with disabilities through features such as wheelchairs access to the pools and large changing facilities
 - Water activities such as a diving board, wave machine and slides
 - Additional facilities such as an ice rink or trampoline

4. Engagement events.

Engagement events

In person events

- Three in person engagement events were held:
 - 4.30pm 7pm at Baking ideas next to Tolworth Station on Thursday 25th November 2021
 - 10am 2pm at the Market Hall in Kingston
 Town Centre on Saturday 27th November
 2021
 - 10am 2pm at the Market Hall in Kingston Town Centre on Saturday 4th December 2021
- Across the three events, 94 people were engaged and engagement material remained at the Market Hall for the duration of the engagement period.

Webinars

- Two public webinars were held on Monday 22nd and Tuesday 30th November between 6pm and 7.30pm, which were attended by 16 people, including two sitting councillors
- 42 questions were asked in total, of which most were posed by the chair to the panel.
- Questions focused on accessibility, sustainability, cost, noise, the planning process, the roof issue and the cattle market.
